



Are you tired of reporting blatant antisemitism and in response, being told it “doesn’t violate our community standards”?

Have you ever wanted to do something about this?



Facebook Help Team

Thank you for taking the time to report something that you feel may violate our Community Standards. Reports like yours are an important part of making Facebook a safe and welcoming environment. We reviewed the Page you reported for containing hate speech or symbols and found it doesn't violate our Community Standards.

Note: If you have an issue with something on the page, be sure to report the content (ex: a photo), not the entire page. That way, your report will be more accurately reviewed.

At the [Global Forum to Combat Antisemitism](#) in May 2015 a major report will be released detailing examples of antisemitic content in social media which have not been removed despite the reports of social media users. The report will cover the three largest social media platforms: Facebook, YouTube and Twitter.

We’re writing to ask for your assistance in globally collating examples of online hate in social media, particularly those where your own efforts to have this content recognised as hate speech and removed have not met with success.

This year’s Global Forum will highlight the difficulties Jewish communities around the world are facing as a result of the spread of antisemitism on the Internet. This antisemitism fuels the sort of

radicalisation and extremism which has so devastated the Jewish community in recent months and years.

There are two ways to get involved in this effort:

Public Participation

Individuals can register on the Fight Against Hate software at <http://fightagainsthate.com>.

After registering, please report items to the platform that hosts them, then report them via the Fight Against Hate reporting tool.

Organisational Participation

Within the software all users belong to a team. All members of a team can see the list of all items members of the team have collectively reported. There is also a ranked list of team members by their level of contribution to the reporting effort.

Each team has a designated team leader, and this person has the ability to invite new users to join the team, and to accept requests for other users to transfer into the team.
